You've heard it before, laughter is the best medicine. Ever wondered the basis for that saying?

Researchers have known for a long time that a good sense of humor has many health benefits. Studies have shown that humor may give people a natural high by activating the same reward centers in the brain that have previously been linked with happiness and drug-induced euphoria.



Magnetic resonance imaging commonly known as MRI was used to study how the brains of a group of adults responded to funny vs. non-funny cartoons. The images detected areas of the brain that were activated when the subject found the cartoon funny. In addition to

activating areas of the brain involved in language processing, humor also stimulated regions of the brain known as reward centers. The amygdala is one reward center that releases dopamine. Dopamine is a powerful chemical that plays a vital role in the brain's pleasure and reward system.

World Autism Day: April 2nd

World Autism Awareness Day is an internationally recognized day on 2 April every year, encouraging Member States of the United Nations to take measures to raise awareness about people with Autism Spectrum Disorder throughout the world. It was designated by the United Nations General Assembly resolution

This year your FCHC family will be wearing light blue and donating \$5 to wear jeans that day and all money collect that day will be donated to Organization for Autism Research



April is National Donate Life Month; How much do you know about Organ Donation?

- The national waiting list for organ transplants is rising at an alarming rate, with nearly 115,000 individuals currently on the list.
- In Ohio, there are more than 2,900 people 580 in Central Ohio waiting for an organ transplant at any time, and hundreds more await tissue and corneal transplants.
- Approximately 20 times each day a man, woman or child dies for lack of an available organ. Once every 48 hours, an
 Ohioan dies waiting.
- In Ohio in 2017, 412 Ohioans shared the Gift of Life through organ donation at the time of their death. Through their unselfish generosity, 1,274 organs were transplanted.
- In Central and Southeastern Ohio in 2017, 124 individuals shared the Gift of Life through organ donation a 33 percent increase over the last year!
- In 2017, 409 organs were transplanted from donors in Central and Southeastern Ohio in 2017. This is a 2 percent increase over the last year!
- In Central and Southeastern Ohio in 2017, 475 individuals shared the Gift of Healing through tissue donation.
- In Central and Southeastern Ohio in 2017, 171 individuals shared the Gift of Sight through cornea donation.
- 34,768 organ transplants were performed in the United States in 2017. 6,181 of those transplants were living donations. 1.75 million tissue transplants were performed nationally in 2017.
- A single donor can potentially save the lives of eight people and heal more than 50 by donating vital organs (heart, two lungs, two kidneys, liver, pancreas and small bowel) and tissue (corneas, bone, fascia, skin, veins and heart valves).
